Item; 103 YEARS LATER...... Women's Equality Day observed on August 26th commemorates the passage of the 19th Amendment in 1920 which gave women the right to vote. The battle for equal voting rights, however, is still an ongoing battle with disenfranchisement efforts being waged across the country. AAUW encourages everyone to urge your member of Congress to support the Equal Rights Amendment. ➤ In July 2023, a new joint resolution ERA Now (H.J. Resolution 82) was introduced in Congress to affirm the ERA and direct the Archivist of the United States to certify and publish the Equal Rights Amendment as the 28th Amendment of the United States Constitution.
