Public Policy

Senator Robert Casey response for support of Equal Rights Amendment:

"First drafted in 1923, the Equal Rights Amendment would add a provision to the Constitution stating that, "[e]quality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or any State on account of sex." Article V of the Constitution provides that an amendment is effective when ratified by three-quarters of the states. Though Article V of the Constitution does not place a time limit on the ratification of a constitutional amendment, after the ERA passed both chambers of Congress in 1972, Congress placed a deadline on the ratification process, requiring that the ERA meet the 38-state requirement by 1982. However, only 35 states ratified the ERA by 1982, falling just three states short of the threshold set by Article V.

On January 24, 2023, Senators Ben Cardin of Maryland and Lisa Murkowskiof Alaska introduced S. J. Res. 4. This resolution would eliminate the time limit for ratification of the ERA and would declare that the ERA shall become part of the Constitution whenever it is ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the states. In our own Commonwealth, Pennsylvania has had an equal rights amendment in its state constitution since 1971, and in 1972, Pennsylvania became the 21st state to ratify the ERA. In 2020, the Commonwealth of Virginia became the 38th state to ratify the amendment.

The ERA would set a new standard for equality in the Nation and help keep Americans safe from gender-based violence, discrimination in the workplace, and restrictions from full participation in civil society. The amendment was driven by the conviction that the strength of our democracy is predicated upon a constitutionally enshrined principle of gender equality, and I believe that ratification is one step Congress must take to rectify longstanding gender-based inequalities that have burdened Americans for too long. For these reasons, I am proud to be a cosponsor of this bipartisan resolution.

On April 27, 2023, Leader Schumer brought S. J. Res. 4 to a vote before the full Senate. Though this resolution received bipartisan support, it failed to meet the 60-vote filibuster threshold to advance to debate by a vote of 51-47."
