2024 AAUW SCHOLARSHIPS

The Beaver Valley Branch of the American Association of University Women (AAUW) will award \$16,000 in scholarships to worthy Beaver County high school senior girls, non-traditional students, a CCBC student, and a law school student. Proceeds from their annual fundraiser, the AAUW Kitchen Tour, provide the funds for these awards.

Three eligible Beaver County high school senior girls and two non-traditional students---women who are returning to college to complete their degrees after an interruption of studies for several years—will each receive a \$2500 scholarship after completing an application. Applications are available on the website and qualifications and

requirements are outlined on the application. Deadline for applications is March 22, 2024.

Information about the \$1000 AAUW Award for a CCBC student is available at the CCBC Advising and Counseling Office at CCBC, and the deadline is also March 22, 2024.

Information about the \$2500 law student scholarship, named Effie Solomon Memorial Scholarship, is also available on the website.

Public Policy

National Equal Pay Day 2024

March 12th marks this year's date in time for the gender inequality pay gap. Based on the latest (2022) U.S. Census information, the average woman who works full time is paid on average 84% of her male counterpart. In dollars and cents: Women who work year-round are paid 84 cents for every dollar paid to men. This date calculation, first started in 1996 by the National Committee on Pay Equity, is to raise awareness about the gender wage gap.

Factors to Consider

It's not just about one paycheck. Due to this pay gap, the average income lost for all women over a 40 year career is approximately \$400,000. (Source: National Women's Law Center, "The Lifetime Wage Gap by State for Women Overall", March 2023.) This disparity further translates into less retirement income with women having 70% of the retirement income of men; and, lower wages mean lower Social Security earnings.

Latest Federal Action

On January 29th, an announcement was made by the White House on the 15th anniversary of the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act to ban the use of current or past pay when determining salaries of new Federal employees. By ending the use of salary history in pay setting decisions, this ensures salaries are based on applicants' skills, experience, and proficiencies. This action is designed to help close the wage gaps and improve pay transparency for employees. Note: President Obama signed the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act on January 29, 2009.

State Action

Over the past years, legislation has been proposed both in the PA House and PA Senate to update the state equal pay law enacted in 1967. No action to date
