PUBLIC POLICY - APRIL 2024

The following is an excerpt of proposed priorities that will be voted upon at the State annual membership meeting scheduled for May 4, 2024. Note: No changes were suggested by the membership or public policy committee.

Proposed AAUW PA Public Policy Priorities 2024-2026

To enable members and all citizens to participate fully in a representative democracy and self-governance, AAUW PA advocates:

- Awareness of issues so that members may be fully informed and empowered voters;
- Opposition to measures likely to suppress voting rights;
- Support for efforts in increase civil discourse and compromise between those with opposing views;

• Efforts to get out the vote, including voter registration and use of social media to promote voting.

To improve the economic self-sufficiency of all women, AAUW PA advocates:

- Pay equity and fairness in compensation and benefits;
- Raising the minimum wage and tipped minimum wage to an amount that would provide a meaningful boost to family incomes in Pennsylvania and help grow the state's economy.

To improve the operation and transparency of government, AAUW PA advocates:

Efforts to end the practice of partisan redistricting, gerrymandering in Pennsylvania.

EDUCATION UPDATES

- 1. The launch for increased funds for the student teacher stipend program has begun. 2000 students applied for the program and only 750 students were granted the limited funds. The program will provide student teachers with \$10,000 for their 12-week program. In return, these students agree to work as educators within PA for 3 years. The economic burden of student teaching is seen as a barrier for many to become an educator.
- 2. House Bill 2063 was introduced. It is intended to create transparency for tax credit voucher programs.
- 3. In February 2023, PA won a landmark victory declaring that our current system for funding public schools is unconstitutional. The PA legislature is still working on formulating another system.

4. Education Voters (an independent advocacy group for education) filed a Right to Know request with Commonwealth Charter Academy (CCA) to seek info on how they used public money for fleet vehicles, marketing staff, food trucks, etc. CCA denied the requests saying they had <u>no</u> records. Education Voters reached out to Auditor General DeFoor requesting an audit of CCA. They were informed that his office is currently auditing CCA. This hopefully will create some transparency on how CCA is spending tax dollars.

On April 19th members met at <u>Conquer the Clock Escape Rooms</u> to solve the mystery of the lost Candy Falls Krunch bar. This is another fun evening activity that we incorporated into our interest groups to help include all members, working and retired.

GIRLS' RECOGNITION NIGHT

Neither flood watch reports nor tornado warnings stopped our GRN held April 11th. at CCBC. Twenty-six eighth grade girls were nominated by their teachers to be recognized in science or math. Lia Hazelwood, Dual Enrollment and Retention Specialist Instructor, Early Childhood was on hand to inform students and parents of opportunities CCBC offered to the high school girls.
