SCHOLARSHIPS – JEAN MACALUSO

Applications will appear on-line on February 3, 2025, and must be completed by March 19, 2025, so encourage any eligible Beaver County senior girl or non-traditional candidate to apply. The committee for selection consists of co-chairs, co-presidents, chair of Kitchen Tour, and chairs of community committee, but the committee will be expanded to include two members-at-large from the membership.

The selection process for choosing the scholarship recipients consists of reading and evaluating all essays and criteria about each candidate, and then submitting your top choices to derive consensus. It is a tedious process but a very concentrated one, over a short period of time.

Members- at-large will serve for two years, but this first year, one member will serve for one year to begin the rotation of every year, a new person is chosen. The early name of the town was Hanover, settled in 1813 by a Quaker abolitionist, which became a safe haven for runaway slaves. The Spread Eagle Inn was built in 1837 and known today as one of the area's finest examples of Federal Period architecture. Supposedly, Abraham Lincoln stopped there as other prominent statesmen in following years.
