After the passing of Frank and his wife Julia, the property changed hands many times and was stripped of many of its magnificent architectural elements such as staircases, chandeliers, and fireplace mantels. Jim and Donna Winner then purchased and restored Julia's "castle" for all to enjoy.

Arrangements have been made to tour the historic mansion commencing at **1PM** on Thursday, October 24th. We will then be able to walk the grounds at our own leisure.
