• The 2025 Kitchen Tour will be held on October 4, 2025. Kim and Allen Litz's daughter is getting married on September 27. There are other local

- community events held on September 20 (Fort MacIntosh Day) and October 11 (Beaver Valley Quilt Show).
- The Marketplace will be located at the newly built IBEW (International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers) building in Vanport. Throughout this past year many members gave me alternative locations. At the wrap up meeting, we vetted 10 locations. The IBEW Building was the strongest option.

The committee had a thoughtful discussion about expanding our geographic reach for houses on the tour. We will continue these discussions. Having the marketplace more centrally located is an asset towards this geographic expansion.

Deb Newton led the task to submit an article about our Kitchen Tour. This article is in the most recent issue of AAUW PA's Keystoner. The Carlisle Branch president contacted Roberta. They wish to learn more about the Kitchen Tour with the idea of holding a similar event.

Our efforts for the 2025 Kitchen Tour will resume after the holiday season. I will reach out to the committee and membership at large in February or early March.
